ACE is a national non-profit organization that began on the East Coast in 1994. Our mission is to excite and enlighten high school students to pursue careers in the integrated construction industry through mentoring; and to support their continued advancement in the industry through scholarships and grants. ACE has expanded to 36 states with over 90 affiliates within the past 16 years.

ACE of Greater Sacramento has served high schools across the Sacramento region since 2007. In our first full year, ACE of Greater Sacramento served over 50 students at three different high schools, along with 25 mentors, all of which could have not happened without the support of our 30 local companies. We have grown over 300 % in the last three years and to date have served over 550 students, 15 high schools who have been mentored by over 140 mentors representing 90 companies surrounding the Sacramento Region.
