Pamela J. Loeffelman is the managing principal of Perkins Eastman's Stamford, Connecticut office. Over the past 30 years, she has worked at small, medium, and large firms, both nationally and internationally, on projects that represent diversity in geography, project type, and project delivery. This diversity of experience has provided Pam with a broad based understanding of such issues as design excellence, mentoring, project management, recruitment and retention, sustainable design, and more recently integrated project delivery and globalization.

Pam has served AIA over the past 10 years in a variety of leadership roles ranging from local to national. She began service as chair of AIA New York State's Committee on Architecture for Education (1998-2000), and secretary on the Board of the component (1999-2000). In 2001, Pam was appointed to the Committee of Architecture for Education's national advisory group for a five year term (2001-2005). In the last year of this appointment, she was elected by her peers to serve on the Board Knowledge Committee. In 2005, she was re-elected to Board Knowledge Committee for an additional three-year term (2005-2008). Pam was elevated to the College of Fellows (2008).

In addition to Pam's service to AIA, she is active in a variety of organizations. She is a North Atlantic Regional Council Member of the Society of College and University Planners (SCUP) and was co-chair and founder of the SCUP-CAE/AIA Awards. She serves on the advisory board for the national Clearinghouse for Educational Facilities, and has been active in the initial planning and implementation of the American Architectural Foundation's "Great Schools by Design" initiatives and programs since 2001.
