Ed Rytter is the President of Oasis Consulting Group, Inc. a small consulting firm he formed on his retirement from Prudential Financial where he was Vice President of Corporate Real Estate. He formed the firm as a vehicle to share the knowledge and experience about corporate business, real estate, and construction derived over a 35-year career in which he served as Division Executive for Real Estate and Construction for a number of major firms including Prudential, Chase Manhattan, American Express and American Airlines.

In 2001, recognizing another need in the industry, Ed with the help of the MCANJ created the Skilled Trades Program designed to interest and direct students to apprentice training which will aid in producing trained electricians, welders, plumbers and other vitally needed trades.

In past years, Ed served as a Director and Treasurer of the National Institute of Building Sciences, President of BOMA NY, Director of the NY Building Congress and as a member of the AGC's Private Industry Advisory Council.

He is currently Treasurer of the Construction Roundtable of New Jersey, Treasurer of the General Society of Mechanics and Tradesmen, a Governor of the NY Building Foundation and serves as Executive Director of the Newark Real Estate Board. He also serves as Chairman of the ACE Mentor Program of New Jersey and is a Director of ACE NY, and ACE of America. As founder and an active participant in his most recent endeavor, Sportsmen for Charity, Inc., established in 2002, he and several friends have helped raise over \$1,000,000 for various children's charities.
