Dear Supporters of ACE,

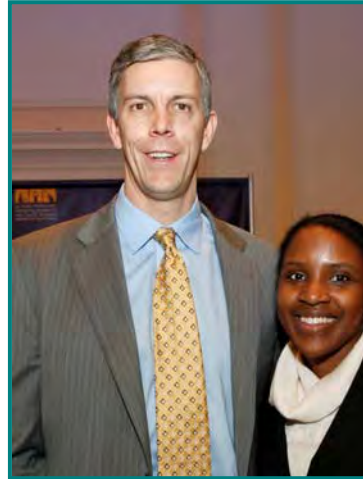

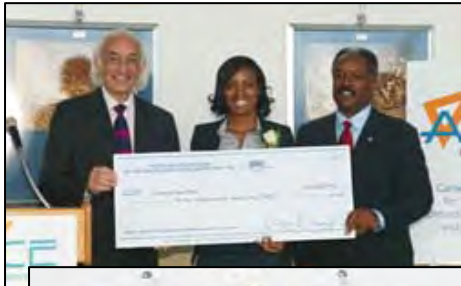

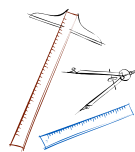
