ABOUT ACE

The ACE Mentor Program of Washington is just one affiliate of the ACE Mentor Program of America, based in Washington D.C. There are 77 affiliates all over the country.

ACE is a 501(c)3 not-for-profit organization. The program's mission is to engage, excite, and enlighten high school students to pursue careers in the integrated construction industry through mentoring; and to support their continued advancement in the industry through scholarships and grants.

ACE in Washington started in Seattle 2001, with just one team with 11 students. It continued to grow, expanding to Bellevue/Eastside in 2006 and Tacoma/SouthSound in 2016. In all, thousands of students have met with hundreds of mentors to learn about architecture, engineering, and construction.

To date, \$764,000 in scholarships have been awarded to seniors going on to study these fields in college, and another \$100,000 will be awarded later this month.

And the best part? Several ACE alumni are back here working for the firms that mentored them -- and mentoring for ACE!



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STUDENT PROJECT

This year, 200+ students from a 64 area high schools completed ACE. Eleven groups (seven in Seattle, two on the Eastside, and two on the south end) met every other week to study every step of the building process, from the initial architectural designs to the final construction components. Each team responded to an "RFP" (Request for Proposal) and tackled a design challenge.

The designs presented tonight respond to two RFPs. One team responded to an RFP that was sent to ACE teams nationally, and the other two teams responded to our Seattle-area RFP.

The national-level RFP was for a water resource management and preservation project, which included identifying a local water infrastructure challenge and proposing either a new solution or renovation/replacement solution.

The local RFP was for a waterfront development, and it gave three sites and potential programs, including:

- ➔ 10,000-square-foot restaurant plus offices & marketplace
- ➔ Waterfront history museum with cafe & marketplace
- ➔ 10,000-square-foot performance hall with open space

ACE this year was unlike any other, with all teams transitioning to virtual learning by mid-March, finishing their design projects together but remotely. Instead of presenting their final designs to an audience of 150+ in lecture halls around Puget Sound, tonight they have recorded their presentations to webcast.

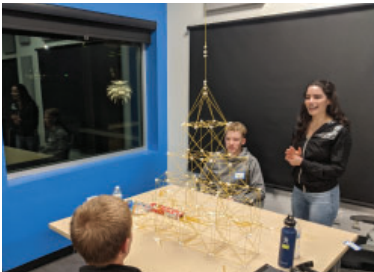
