PROGRAM IMPACT

Since 2021, the ACE Mentor Program CA Capital has introduced local high school students to the architecture, engineering, and construction industries, inspiring the next generation through hands-on learning, mentorship, and financial support for educational advancement.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS (2021-2024)

- Participating Schools: 3
- Students Engaged: 120 students completed the program
- Mentorship Support: Over 25 industry mentors guiding and inspiring students
