Dear Friends and Supporters,

As we begin celebrating 20 years of ACE Mentor Program programming in Northeast Florida, we are proud to reflect on another year of growth, innovation, and impact. What began as a vision to introduce students to careers in architecture, construction, and engineering has evolved into a thriving program that continues to transform lives and strengthen our industry's future workforce.

During the 2025-2026 program year, ACE Northeast Florida served more than 260 students from 13 locations, supported by 85 dedicated industry mentors. Together, these volunteers provided weekly mentoring, career guidance, and hands-on learning experiences that helped students explore pathways into the design and construction industry.

This year, we launched several exciting new initiatives designed to deepen student engagement and strengthen connections with our ACE alumni. New programs included the Gingerbread Design-Build Competition, the Build-a-Bench Day, and an expanded alumni engagement initiative featuring professional networking events, lunch & learn sessions, and alumni arcade night. We also expanded student access to technology by providing laptops with industry-related software and Wi-Fi routers to ensure participants can fully engage in ACE programming and opportunities.

At the same time, we continued to deliver the high-impact experiences that have become hallmarks of our program. Students participated in our Program Kickoff & College Tour, Technology Bootcamp, Weekly Mentoring Sessions, Trades Day, and Externship opportunities. ACE also organized eight Construction Site and Industry Office visits, giving students firsthand exposure to the wide range of careers available in the built environment.

Our Design Competition continues to thrive. This year, 26 regional teams developed project proposals and presented their work at our Year-End Event. Through our expanding trades-focused programming, students also constructed 28 benches as part of our regional Trades Construction competition, showcasing both technical skills and teamwork. Additionally, eight national teams

submitted projects in the prestigious Construction Industry Round Table (CIRT) Design and Construction Competition.

Supporting students beyond high school remains central to our mission. This year, ACE Northeast Florida awarded \$82,500 in scholarships to 26 graduating seniors and three junior mentors. We also continued to expand educational pathways through our partnership with Florida A&M University, creating additional opportunities through the ACE to FAMU Scholarship program.

Our success wouldn't be possible without the support of our Diamond, Platinum, Gold Silver, and Bronze industry partners. Our Premium partnership with Brasfield & Gorrie remains strong and continues to be instrumental in helping us implement innovative programming while sustaining our multi-year scholarship commitments. We are also grateful for our continued collaboration with North Florida's National Organization of Minority Architects (NoFlo NOMA) Project Pipeline, which helps introduce students to architecture and design careers while expanding access and opportunity for underrepresented youth.

This year, we were especially proud to celebrate two nationally recognized volunteers whose dedication exemplifies the impact of ACE mentorship. Their leadership

- Monique Brown was honored as ACE National's Outstanding Mentor of the Year, recognizing her exceptional commitment to guiding and inspiring students.
- Kim Ebbers was recognized as Outstanding School Champion, honoring her steadfast advocacy and support for ACE programming. ACE remains committed to preparing the next generation of architects, engineers, constructors, and skilled trades professionals. The achievements of this year demonstrate the power of mentorship, industry engagement, and community partnership. Together, we are building brighter futures for students and a stronger workforce for our region.

As we look ahead, we invite all of you to join us in January as we celebrate the ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida's milestone 20-year anniversary. We look forward to honoring the students, mentors, partners, and supporters who have made two decades of impact possible and celebrating the bright future that lies ahead.

ACE MENTOR PROGRAM OF NORTHEAST FL



Founded during the 2006-2007 school year, the ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida (ACE NEFL) helps high school students explore potential careers in architecture, construction and engineering. Through the program, mentors from local industry professional firms meet with students once a week for 18-20 weeks. During these sessions, students work in teams to create practical solutions for “real-world” projects. It’s an effective way for students to experience the reality of what architects, contractors and engineers do during a typical working day.

The 2025-2026 program year was a success both in terms of students served and donations raised from industry partners, individuals and foundations. ACE NEFL increased our reach to 13 locations, serving 269 students weekly and awarded \$82,000 to 24 high school seniors and 3 junior mentors.

About ACE

Founded in 1994, the ACE Mentor Program of America (ACE) is a no-cost after-school program that connects high school students with professionals in architecture, construction, engineering and the skilled trades. Today, ACE serves students through affiliate programs across the United States and Canada.

ACE is one of the nation’s fastest-growing workforce development programs, serving more than 14,000 students annually from over 1,800 high schools. More than 70% of students identify as people of color, about 40% identify as young women and more than 40% of ACE seniors entering college are first-generation scholars.

More than 5,000 volunteer industry professionals mentor students through hands-on design and construction projects that introduce them to careers across the built environment.

Last year, ACE awarded more than \$4.8 million in scholarships, bringing total scholarship support to nearly \$42 million since its founding. More than 90% of ACE alumni continue on to college or skilled trades training, while 70% pursue an industry-related field of study. Through Summer Workplace Experiences, Summer Camps and the Transformative Partner Program, ACE helps prepare an estimated 1,500 to 2,000 alumni to enter the AEC workforce each year.

2025-26 PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The ACE program enjoyed a successful 2025-2026. We served 269 students across Northeast Florida, including 134 students from under-represented groups.

Students met weekly at 13 locations: Atlantic Coast High School (HS), Baker County HS, Bartram Trail HS, Bishop Kenny HS, Creekside HS, Middleburg HS, Nease HS, Orange Park HS, Paxon School for Advanced Studies, Pedro Menendez HS, Riverside HS, Toco Creek HS and RS&H hosts our Home School Team.

This year's regional request for proposal (RFP) competition had three topics to choose from and **26 teams competed**. Eight teams also submitted their projects for the CIRT National Design Competition.

- Modular Classroom (8 teams)
- Animal Shelter & Adoption Center (9 teams)
- Community Park (9 teams)
- CIRT National Design and Construction (8 teams)

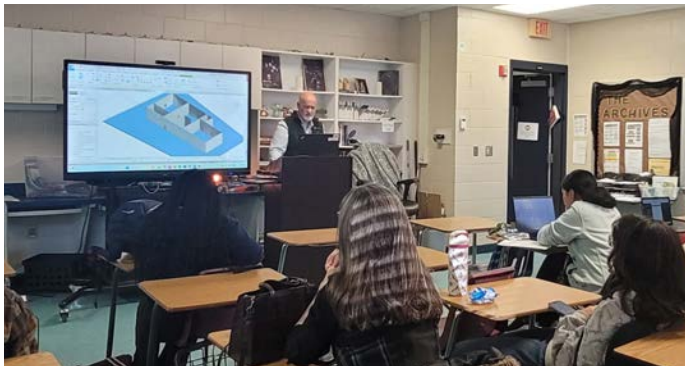
TECHNOLOGY BOOTCAMP GOES MOBILE

To increase accessibility and participation, our Technology Bootcamp evolved from a single Saturday event into a mobile learning model with mentor, Kevin Davenport traveling to multiple locations throughout the community. This transition helped remove common barriers to participation, including transportation challenges, work schedules, and other personal commitments that often prevent students from attending centralized events.

To further support equitable access, we provided laptops preloaded with industry-relevant software, ensuring participants had the tools needed to engage in hands-on learning experiences. Additionally, Wi-Fi modems were supplied to locations requiring enhanced internet connectivity, allowing all participants to fully access digital resources and training opportunities regardless of their local technology infrastructure.

The projects showcased their innovation and technical skills and included a bench construction to highlight the trades component of the project.
- **Special Recognition** – Kim Ebbers with our Home School Team received national honors as the Exemplary School Champion, and Paxon SAS Mentor, Monique Brown was awarded Outstanding Mentor from both ACE National and our affiliate.
- **Scholarships** – We awarded scholarships totaling \$82,500 to 26 deserving seniors and 3 junior mentors pursuing careers in architecture, construction and engineering. These scholarships are made possible through corporate giving at the platinum, diamond, gold and silver level.
- **Volunteer Appreciation** – The event closed with a heartfelt appreciation of our mentors, teachers, volunteers and parents in the vital role they each play in supporting ACE student success.

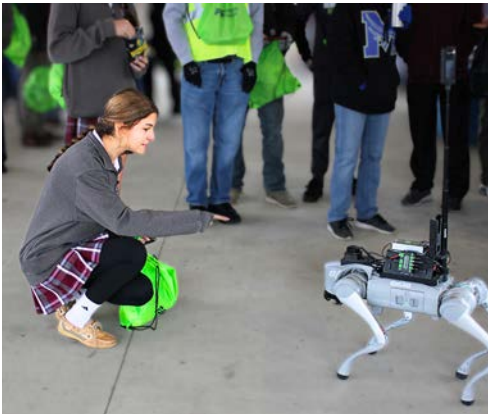
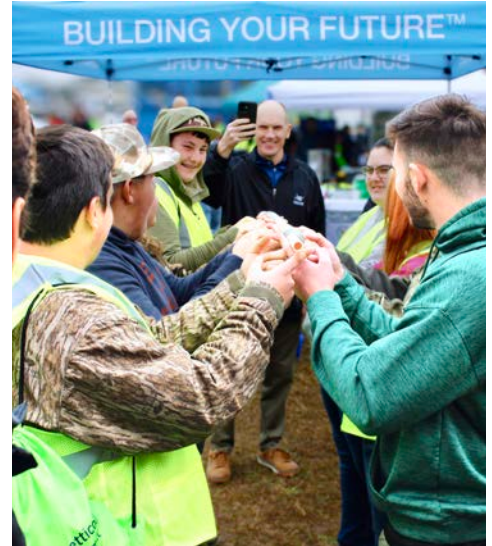

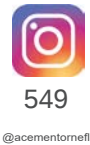
This year's accomplishments reflect continued progress across the organization's five strategic focus areas.

Together, these efforts are building a stronger organization and creating lasting opportunities for the next generation of architecture, engineering, construction and skilled trades professionals.

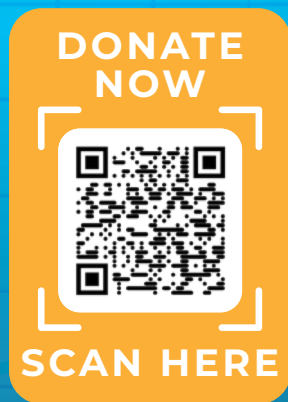


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
